

Michael Bennet KB1WFS had the boys outside using a Handheld transceiver and demonstrating different antennas - whip, yagi and of course rubber duckie. Meanwhile, up at the EOC, **Derek Bennet KB1WFP** used the 2 Meter Base Station to make local repeater contacts with Scouts at Camp Norse and other Massachusetts locations.

Jeff Boltz KB1TEG gave a demonstration of EchoLink, enabling contacts in far away states such as California, Nebraska, Illinois and Pennsylvania. Several international contacts were made as well. A Morse code practice set with an informative Morse code handout was set up on display and enjoyed by many of the boys.

HURRICANE SANDY By: The Bruce" NI1X

There was talk on the REPEATER of lowering PREPARATION: antenna towers and putting a little extra slack in dipole antennas as area HAMs prepared for Hurricane Sandy and stocked up with supplies.

On Monday morning October 29, 2012 the rain started slowly and the winds started to pick up as the day went on. The storm peaked in this area between 3 p.m. and 8 p.m. with the winds gusting at 60 MPH around here and 80 MPH gusts reported on the Cape. We received 3.5 inches of rain.

There were widespread power outages. This included the section of Whitman where the Whitman REPEATER is located. Gary Cumiskey W1GRC reported that the Whitman REPEATER was off line because the backup generator voltage regulator failed. The generator was repaired **Power line burning on** the next day and commercial power was restored shortly thereafter. Locust St. in Raynham Power to everyone in our area took from 1 thru 5 days to restore.

We were the lucky ones as the storm went ashore in New Jersey and then headed west and north circling around us leaving a path of destruction that included coastal flooding, trees down. power outages and lives lost.

SAFETY FIRST: Andy Niles KB1RSR saw a primary wire burning in the road near his house. The top wires, on a pole line, on porcelain insulators (1, 2 or 3 phase wires) are the primary wires. In this area the voltage is 13.8KV line to line and 8KV line to ground. Lethal if touched.

CLOSE CALL: Jim Wolf N1JCW reported that while on the road, he watched a tree fall over resulting in a low power line that he could not avoid. His truck antennas, (an outbacker HF vertical and a 10-Meter vertical), were damaged when he passed under the low wires.

MASS. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (MEMA) REGION II: John Miller N1UMJ - Net Control Operator and Mike Leger N1YLQ - MEMA Region II Radio Officer were operating as WC1MAB from MEMA Region II Headquarters (the bunker) located on the State Prison property in Bridgewater. Doug Forbes Jr. SWL is the MEMA Region II local Coordinator.

Mike N1YLQ reported that they handled about 100 messages in 36 hours that included valuable disaster intelligence gathering information reports that were passed on to MEMA Headquarters and National Weather Service Taunton.

BRIDGEWATER EOC: Phil McNamara N1XTB operated from home and coordinated the staffing of the town of Bridgewater Emergency Operations Center (EOC) which serves as a regional Amateur

The other is our amateur radio station. We have a Ten-Tec Omni HF Transceiver and a Yaesu Ft-8800 VHF-UHF Transceiver. Above the penthouse, we have a tri-band yagi for 10-15-20 meters and a wire antenna for 40-80 meters, we also have a Station-Master for VHF use. Being on the roof we have the advantage of height for antennas, our tri-bander is at 75 feet above the ground! Members have unlimited access to the space and use it for working on projects or just hanging out between classes.

Needed <> Amateur Radio operators to continue tradition <>

Calling all 'HAMs' to carry on the 30 year old tradition of transmitting good will over the airways Saturday and Sunday following Thanksgiving from Plimoth Plantation.

WE NEED YOU!!

<u>Friday November 23 at 10:00am</u> we will be setting up temporary antennas, (no experience needed), and at least 5 stations on site. All 'HAMs' are welcome to come and operate Saturday and Sunday, (no experience needed). A control operator will be there to assist and allow those who do not have a license to operate on the HF bands to get on the air.

Saturday and Sunday Nov. 24 and 25 from 9:00 to 15:00

WE NEED YOU TO OPERATE THIS YEAR. First timers are welcome. We will assist you.

HAM operators tell the story of Plimoth Plantation over the airways. A script and other materials are provided for guidance to explain the many interesting things about the living museum over the air.

This special event is published in the December ARRL QST monthly magazine, which has both national and international distribution. You will find Amateur Radio operators from all over the world anxious to make contact with Plimoth Plantation either via HF radio or 'EchoLink' through our Whitman 2-Meter repeater.

A display and two stations are set up at the visitors' center where patrons can listen to conventional voice HAM stations. Children visiting the Plantation and stopping by the display are encouraged to send their name in Morse code with a practice code oscillator available for them to try out. The adults visiting the display are encouraged to send RADIOGRAM messages free of charge from the Plantation to friends and relatives via amateur radio.

We explain that during special events, like this one, amateur radio operators practice sending routine messages, via radio to amateur radio operators in local neighborhoods who deliver their messages by telephone free of charge. We also explain how these routine messages could quickly change to priority or emergency messages in times of National emergencies. Many of this years patrons will be fascinated to be able to send someone a "RADIOGRAM" from the Plantation this year.

Each amateur who contacts the Club station **WA1NPO** is entitled to receive a certificate, suitable for framing, which includes a picture of Mayflower II and confirms the date and time of the contact. Short wave listeners are equally eligible for the certificate by contacting the Club by mail.

This event is easy and fun to do. No admission fee is required for participants and their helpers. If asked, just mention that you are with the radio club.

Volunteer now for the antenna crew on Friday, (no experience needed), or Saturday or Sunday (no experience needed), to operate at one of our radio stations. Volunteers are also very much needed for take down on Sunday at 13:30 > 15:00.
